

Episode 1 – Who we are in Christ

Question 1

We are Born of God

'Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God'

John 1:12

- a. What does John mean when he writes "To all who receive him"?

- b. How does this happen?
See Romans 10:9

Question 2

'Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires.'

2 Peter 1:4

- a. What does it mean for us to share in 'the divine nature'?
(also see John 1: 13, 3: 5-6)

- b. What does being 'children of God' say about the 'new nature' we now have?

- c. Read 1 Peter 1:23.
 - What are the key words that describe the seed/word of God?
(please note a mistake: The Greek word seed in 1 Peter 1:23 is *sporos*. The word '*sperma*' appears in 1 John 3.9)

 - What makes this so important to us as we understand that we are children of God?

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Question 3

How does this understanding of being a child of God:

- Challenge you?

- Encourage you?

Question 4

Consider the water and glass illustration. Practice explaining/doing the water and glass illustration. This will help you own it for yourself.

Take time and consider the life of Jesus and what he was like and what he was able to do.

If Christ Himself now lives in you by his Spirit what is now possible for you.

Prayerfully own these things for your self

Question 5

What mind-sets do you struggle with that would cause you to not believe these incredible truths?

Question 6

a. What strikes you about the Leanne Payne story of the Rabbi and Jesus?

b. How does this story reveal the truth to you?

Question 7

If God makes 'Genius stuff' how might that effect how you view yourself and shape your understanding of yourself? (See Ephesians 2:10)

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Question 8

Take time pondering, considering and praying in to the enormity of what God has done in you. Above all 'Thank Him' for what He HAS done. What He IS doing, what He WILL do in you and through you.

What does 2 Kings Chapter 6 have to say to us today?

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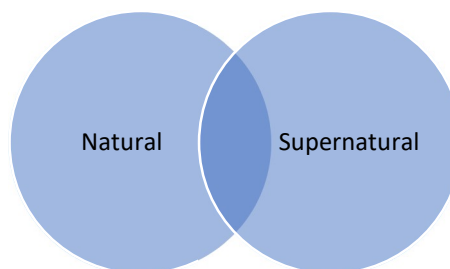
What mind-sets/experiences/teaching in your life have caused you to:

Question 6- Study these verses:

2. The spiritual realm around the earth: See Ephesians 2:1-3
2 Corinthians 4:4
3. The Realm of Gods glory, presence and uninterrupted rule and reign
The 'Kingdom come' Mt 6:9-13
Isaiah 9:7 (note government means kingdom)

What does the illustration of the Jewish primary school teachers have to say to us?

Question 7

How do we stay:

Episode 3 – Rich in Christ

Question 1

‘For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.’

2 Corinthians 8:9

- a. In what ways did Jesus become poor? (Greek work ‘ptocheuo’ meaning bankrupt or destitute)

- b. How did this reveal ‘the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ’?

- c. Traditionally the church has taught that we are ‘poor’ – yet Christ has made us rich. Why is it humble to believe this truth?

- d. Does anything within you resist daring to believe you are ‘rich in God’?

Question 2

- a. How does the story of Zsolt and Geza Peladi impact you?

- b. What’s the key to the story’s relevance to us?

Ephesians 1:8

What does ‘the Riches of the glorious inheritance in the saints mean?’
(literally the riches of the inheritance of glory in the saints)

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Question 3

- a. How does the story of the Christian carrying the light impact you?

- b. What do you think you carry as your supernatural inheritance 'In Christ'?

Question 4

Why do we need to 'possess our possessions'?

Question 5

Living a supernatural lifestyle begins with and is founded upon the understanding that you are a child of God? Why is this crucial?

Question 6

Read Colossians 1:22

Hebrews 10:14

Ephesians 1:1 Holy people (hagios means saint of Holy one)

- a. Why does God call us 'Holy'?

- b. How have we been made 'Holy'?

- c. Why is this crucial to believe to live a consistently intimate relationship with a 'Holy' Father?

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Question 7

We are created In Christ to hear Gods voice as His children. Study these scriptures to see how God speaks to His people.

Question 8

What Questions could you ask of God today that concern your own life and the issues you face?

Question 9

How does the ATM illustration relate to our everyday lives?

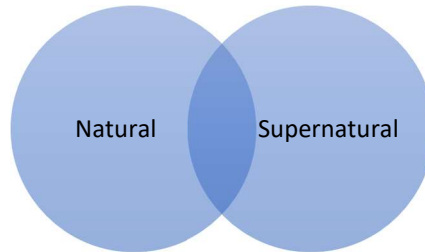
